EW DELHI, SEPT 17, 2020: Committee has been constituted under the Chairpersonship of the Vice Chancellor, National Law University, elhi to suggest reforms in the Criminal laws.

The Ministry of Home Affairs ave also sought suggestions from Governors, Chief Ministers of States, Lieutenant Governors (LGs) and Affairs of Union Torritories, Chief Justice of India, Chief Justices of various High Courts, Bar Council of India, Bar Council of various States and various Universities/ Law Institutes on comprehensive amendments in Criminal laws. The suggestions received and the Report of the Committee are subject to examination by the Ministry of Home Affairs in consultation with all stakeholders.Â
