rowing global interest in AYUSH-based disease-preventive solutions in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, AYUSH Trade and Industry is aring up to meet the demand for Ayurveda medicine.

The ministry issued timely advisories, and develop the post-COVID management and National Clinical Management Protocol based on Ayurveda and Yoga. The ministry has also taken up a massive campaign to encourage individuals to adopt disease-preventive measures and use the AYUSH system for protection from the virus.
