

Education Ministry denies NIOS taking 'Gita, Ramayan to madrassas'

EW DELHI, MAR 03, 2021: HE Education Ministry on Wednesday said the reports of the new National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) rriculum teaching ancient Ir ian knowledge and heritage at 100 madrassas has "misrepresented truth" and is of "malicious intent." the ministry was reacting to make the ministry was reacting to make the courses on Bharatiya Raramapara (Indian Knowledge Traditions) for classes 3, 5 and 8, teaching the Ramayana, Bhagvad Gita, Panini-propounded

The reports said the courses will be started at 100 madrassas with plans to extend it to 500 in the future.

The Education Ministry reacted and said,

Maheswara Sutras and numerous other collections.

"This news has distorted facts, has misrepresented truth and seems to be of malicious intent."

They further clarified that around 100 Madrassas with 50,000 students are accredited with NIOS, with plans to accredit around 500 more with the NIOS, dependant on the demand.

The ministry said that NIOS accredits madrassas under 'Special provision for quality education of Madrassas' where various subjects are offered to learners and they can opt for any combination of courses, unlike that in the formal education system.

"It is totally the discretion of the learner to opt for subject combination from the bouquet of the subjects provided by NIOS," the ministry emphasised.
